Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Family counseling sessions available as appropriate. The program coordinates and supports home visits including supervised visits in office and transportation provision to client or family when needed. Family members are encouraged to be an active part of the treatment team, are invited to treatment conferences and receive copies of treatment plans.

Special Interventions Available Internally

Clinical/Crisis consultation available 24/7 from agency licensed psychologist and clinical team. Specific consultation available utilizing agency Juvenile Sex Offender Team and Substance Abuse Team. TFC has 24 hour on-call support, respite homes, specialized training for foster parents. Case managers provide weekly counseling as appropriate to client need.
