### Supplemental Information

Benchmark Family Services Berea provides quality services to all youth, including therapeutic case management with weekly contact and visits within the foster home monthly. We also provide twenty-four hour crisis intervention, in-house therapeutic services, and in-house psychiatric services. Our goal is to provide stable placements for youth when entering our agency and we strive to have an 80% favorable discharge rate each month. We focus often on placement preservation and preventing disruption of youth or unnecessary moves through adding additional interventions within the home when needed. Benchmark works closely with DCBS and provides detailed documentation monthly in regards to the children's progress towards goals and overall wellbeing. Each youth placed with our agency receives a thorough psycho-social assessment by our Treatment Director and any identified needs will be addressed within the youth's quarterly updated treatment plan. We have a therapist on staff that utilizes Cognitive Behavioral Therapy, Play Therapy, Substance Abuse Counseling, and Motivational Interviewing. Benchmark Family Services is available twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week for referral calls. We assist with transportation to and from placements, supervision of biological visits for placed youth, and arranging and supervising sibling

### Psychiatric Services

BFS contracts with a Psychiatrist that provides all psychiatric/medication management services needed to youth in placement. On average it takes 2-3 weeks after admission to get have a client seen by the psychiatrist. In addition to daily therapeutic care and weekly case management, we offer Cognitive Behavioral Therapy, onsite psychiatric services, in home independent living services and 24/7 crisis management.

Family is invited to Treatment Team meetings, visitation and they receive a copy of the treatment plan each time one is updated. Foster children are encouraged to remain in contact with their parents. Family therapy services are offered as requested by DCBS.
