Whenever possible, families are involved in treatment planning, regular family therapy and visitation while a client is participating in the program. Staff members also work with families to develop aftercare plans and to secure community resources prior to reunification.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

Boys and Girls Haven offers therapeutic interventions to meet the individual needs of our clients. These interventions include substance abuse services, equine-assisted therapy, JSO counseling, recreational programs and cultural activities. We assist clients with enrolling in education programs that are appropriate to their needs. All clients ages 12 and older participate in IL and life skills education. Vocational training and job placement services are also available for eligible clients.
