## Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

CHNK actively promotes family reintegration whenever possible. Families are invited and encouraged to participate in Family Therapy, treatment team and ARC meetings, visits with their child and to a maintain telephone contact to the greatest extent possible. When reunification is not possible, CHNK collaborates with DCBS and other agencies to identify appropriate alternatives, and the provision of family treatment to assist children moving into foster or pre-adoptive homes.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

Clinicians experienced in multiple evidence-based treatment models, including Trauma-Focused CBT, Motivational Interviewing, Nurturing Parenting, and Juvenile Sexual Offending Counselor Certification Program. Evidence-researched practices include Sanctuary Model. SUD services are provided by clinicians under the supervision of a Licensed Certified Alcohol and Drug Counselor utilizing The Seven Challenges Program.
