Children are seen by our Psychiatrist within 4 weeks of admission and every 5 weeks thereafter. We contract with our Psychiatrist and she is here weekly for an entire day and on-call to us throughout the week. DCCH also contracts with a Psychologist who consults on cases assisting in developing effective interventions. She also interviews children as needed to assist in more detailed feedback.
