Foothills Academy provides residential treatment, emergency shelter, and an alternative to detention programs. Services are provided for seventy (72) young men between the ages of 13 and 18. The program is located on approximately 60 acres of land in Clinton County, Kentucky, six miles west of Albany. Services include individual, family and group counseling along with a drug and alcohol program. Foothills Academy has an approved licensure as a Behavioral Health Services Organization from the Office of Inspector General. Foothills Academy is accredited by the Council of Accreditation. Foothills Academy has an on-site school under the tutelage of the Clinton County Public School District. Foothills Academy youth are also given the opportunity to earn trips off campus that include giving back to the community and enjoying recreational activities. Treatment furloughs are offered to assist the youth with transitioning back to their community and reunification with their family.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Client is encouraged to communicate through phone calls, letters, Sunday visitation. Family counseling sessions are made available at the convenience of the family. We strongly encourage treatment furloughs and day passes.

Special Interventions Available Internally

Foothills Academy's substance abuse program is a licensed Alcohol and Other Drug Entity (AODE) program. Upon admission clients complete a SASSI assessment, which helps us determine the severity of their substance abuse. We then develop a treatment plan based on the client's individual needs. The program consists of ten group sessions which meet one time per week. These sessions are based on the Matrix Model from SAMSHA, which focuses on the client seeing a need to change, preparing to change and maintaining their sobriety by giving back to the community. Some of the topics covered during the group sessions include values, importance of positive friendships, how substance abuse affects the community and family, and relapse prevention. Clients will also work out of the Client Handbook which is evidenced based material from SAMHSA. GED and college classes are available on campus.
