Psychiatric Services

Home of the Innocents employs one psychiatrist and an APRN-Psychiatry, on-site 32 hours weekly, to provide evaluation, diagnosis and treatment for children and youth in need of psychiatric services. Currently appointments are available within 3-4 weeks of admission. There are cases that are able to be scheduled on a triage basis sooner. Village Pharmacy is on the campus and serves the residents as well as the general public. Also on campus, through Open Arms Children's Health Clinic psychological services such as school consultations, Individual and family therapy and psychological testing for children from birth to age eighteen and their families are also available.
