## Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Each client is assigned a Family Consultant and a Foster Family who, together, provide a variety of supportive services to birth families, including co-supervision of visitation with DCBS as required, transportation to and from visits with the natural family, family therapy with natural family, individual therapy for natural parents if they wish to access it, case management/referral services for natural parents, and more.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

We are able to provide a complete continuum of care within the agency, from crisis stabilization and respite at our emergency shelter and residential program, to aftercare services for clients ages 18-24, and special services for pregnant and parenting teens and children with autism and other developmental delays. Our home-based services can also continue with clients who are returned to their natural family post-discharge from the TLC program. We also provide free individual therapy to foster parents and their biological and adopted children as a method of retaining families who work with sometimes difficult clients.
