We currently contract with our local physician for a psychiatric nurse practitioner who evaluates each youth within 21 days of admission in our on campus clinic. She is scheduled twice a month and evaluates all youth on psychiatric medications every 4-6 weeks or when clinically needed for medication management and/or for additional evaluation.

## Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Hope Hill supports family reunification by encouraging families to become involved in the treatment planning process and through individual, group and family therapy. When needed family therapy is offered after hours and on weekends. Hope Hill facilitates family involvement by assisting with transporting youth for weekend home visits where feasible.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

We provide medically fragile services to youth with diabetes. We provide group therapy for victims of trauma (physical and sexual abuse, neglect, domestic violence and human trafficking) and youth with a history of aggression. We provide secure cottages for girls with chronic AWOL issues. We have one cottage with a focus on Substance Abuse recovery and one cottage designated for Transitional Living (Pre-Independent Living) for youth ages 15-18. We provide Equine counseling. We also having an on-site clinic and have a full-time medical coordinator who provides medical consultation after hours where needed.
