## Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

KIFS staff works in conjunction with DCBS to facilitate and supervise visitation when needed. KIFS staff transports to visitation, if foster parents are not able. Foster parents facilitate phone contact and unsupervised visitation. Foster families are taught how to work toward reunification, how to interact with family of origin, and are trained that reunification is always the first goal..

## Special Interventions Available Internally

TF-CBT, one-on-one support specialists to visit the home weekly or on an as needed basis, therapy for all children regardless of LOC when needed.
