Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Key Assets involves the birth families in the treatment of the youth in our care to the fullest extent possible. Specifically, deemed appropriate by DCBS, we invite birth families to be active participants in our Team Parenting meetings. Key Assets provides multiple opportunities for communication via phone/FaceTime, Skype and on site visits in addition to providing transportation to visits and supervise visits as needed.

Special Interventions Available Internally

In addition to individual therapy provided by a certified social worker using TF-CBT, Key Assets provides ABA services through internal and external providers. Where appropriate, Vocational Rehabilitation is involved in assessing youth regarding their option for employment in the community. Almost all youth will qualify for Speech/Language and Occupational Therapy, therefore, this is provided on site at the Key Assets office in Lexington. Additionally, Dr.Hatim Omar specializes in adolescent medicine and youth with disabilities and he oversees youth's medical and psychiatric care.
