**Psychiatric Services**

Each child admitted to Kulima Care will receive a psychiatric evaluation within the first 30 days of admission to our agency. We have established strong partnerships with psychiatrists throughout the state to ensure those needing psychiatric services are seen promptly. Kulima Care also makes it a priority to communicate with previous psychiatric providers so that new transitions are smooth. All of our foster parents are trained in medication management, and the proper way to document the administration of all medication, under the supervision and support of our staff.

## Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

It is important to our organization that we include the child's biological family in their treatment. Kulima Care provides an orientation to the child's biological family dependent upon what is specified in the court order and the child's plan of service. The orientation consists of a discussion about the foster care service, the biological families continuing involvement with the child and the agency, and a discussion of their rights and responsibilities while the child is in foster care. Our agency will also meet face-to-face with the child's biological family within the first month of placement when this is indicated by the child's service plan. The agency will continue to meet with the biological parents to help the family reach goals in order to increase preparedness for reunification.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

In addition to our 24 Hour Crisis support to foster parents, our agency has trained foster parents who are prepared to receive children in their home, 24/7, in an effort to de-escalate negative emotions and prevent future disruptions.
