Psychiatric Services

All IL youth receive an initial assessment to identify immediate safety risks and determine mental health interventions. The IL youth is assigned a Necco clinician and case manager, and referred to a community-contracted psychiatrist, as needed. Referrals for treatment are made timely to ensure that the youth can receive services and avoid lapses in treatment. Necco will communicate with the previous psychiatric provider for medication management, as needed. Necco staff teaches IL youth about the importance and benefits of therapeutic services and medication management.

In addition to weekly case management services, treatment planning and 24-hour crisis support, Necco provides a wide range of specialized therapy interventions. Our highly trained clinicians collaborate with case managers, state workers, IL youth, and other service providers to ensure quality services that include goal-directed, individualized treatment and support to IL youth. For the Louisville, KY location, specialized interventions available internally include: crisis intervention, substance abuse monitoring and treatment, trauma treatment, sexual abuse, attachment disorders, family therapy, PTSD, ADHD, conduct disorder, ODD, depression and other mood disorders, psycho-educational training available to IL youth as needed.
