NBFS provides a full continuum of services for children and families we serve. We provide a high level of therapeutic support. NBFS is accredited by COA. We provide treatment foster care for children from birth to 18. Services include: Licensed, Master's level therapist assigned to each client with weekly contact for treatment integration to include individual, family, and collateral therapy to aid in stabilization and reunification. In home or in-office therapy for each client; crisis support; case management with weekly contact and face to face visits 2-4 times monthly. Each foster parent is trained in managing behaviors, medication management, birth family connections, sexual abuse, as well as many other important, specialized areas. NBFS also offers a community based program, which allows clients to continue with their therapist after being discharged if the family wishes to continue services.

## Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

NBFS encourages biological family members to participate in the youth's treatment planning. Family therapy is offered to promote healthy attachment and ease the child's transition back into the home. NBFS provides biological family with support services, including counseling, coordination of community resources, advocacy, and skill development and parenting training. Foster families are provided continuous training about partnering with biological family members to realize the goal of reunification. Foster parents are trained in Birth Family Connections and its importance for the child's growth and healing process.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

NBFS provides 24/7 support and crisis intervention. Crisis intervention consists of but not limited to all Clinical Consultants providing phone and/or face to face intervention. Psychiatric recommendations can be made for further evaluation or possibly hospitalization pending consultation with all Clinical Consultants. NBFS therapists are licensed, Master's level therapists specializing in child or adolescent, anxiety, behavioral issues and utilize evidence based methods. Foster parents receive mandatory Trauma Informed Care, Behavior Management, Non-Violent Crisis Intervention training, Sexual Abuse training, and many more specialized training courses.
