New Beginnings Family Services (NBFS) provides a full continuum of services for children and families. We pride ourselves on offering a wide range of therapeutic services to foster families and to community-based clients. Services include: behavioral, emotional, trauma, parenting, risk assessment, de-escalation, and community support. NBFS is accredited by COA. We currently provide treatment foster care for children from birth to 18-years-old. Services include: Licensed, Master's level therapist assigned to each client with weekly contact for treatment integration - therapists have training in TF-CBT and are Trauma Certified – to include individual, family, and collateral therapy to aid in stabilization and reunification; In-home and in-office therapy for each client; Crisis support; case management with weekly contact and in face to face visits 2-4 times monthly. Specialized homes include: pre-IL, teen parent, large sibling groups, foster to adopt. Each foster parent is trained in managing behaviors, medication management, family reunification and birth family connections, sexual abuse, as well as many other important, specialized areas.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

NBFS encourages biological family members to participate in the youth's treatment planning. Family therapy is offered to promote healthy attachment and ease the child's transition back into the home. NBFS provides biological family with support services, including counseling, coordination of community resources, advocacy, and skill development and parenting training. Foster families are provided continuous training about partnering with biological family members to realize the goal of reunification. Foster parents are trained in Birth Family Connections and its importance for the child's growth and healing process.

Special Interventions Available Internally

NBFS provides 24/7 support and in-home therapy. Clinical Consultants are available 24/7 to provide phone and face-to-face crisis intervention. NBFS therapists are licensed, Master's level therapists specializing in sexual abuse, substance abuse, and disorders common to abused/neglected children, and utilize evidence based methods. Therapists are trained in TF CBT and are Trauma Certified. Foster parents receive mandatory Trauma Informed Parenting, Behavior Management, Non-Violent Crisis Intervention training, Sexual Abuse training, and many more specialized training courses.
