### Supplemental Information

All SJCH Residential children receive 24/7, 365 days per year therapeutic care, crisis on call availability to a master's level therapist, our staff nurse, and crisis access to our contractual psychiatrist. All children receive weekly individual and group therapy by a master's level therapist that also serves as the case manager for the child and leads the treatment planning based on each child's individual needs. SJCH operates on the STEPS program, a goal focused program developed specifically for the individual success of each child and the varied population we serve. SJCH has an activities program geared towards self-esteem and confidence building, life skills and improving physical health. Children who can safely participate do so, with staff assistance and supervision, in community activities such as Scouts, martial arts lessons, and charity running races. All staff are trained in Safe Crisis Management, working with attachment disordered and sexually reactive children, and "Trauma Informed Care."

## Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

SJCH Residential Treatment Therapists can provide family therapy weekly, or as determined by the courts. SJCH provides supervised visits/phone calls, as needed. SJCH works with state workers to arrange transportation for families when that is an issue that could hinder progress in treatment. All families are invited and strongly encouraged to participate in monthly Treatment Planning for each resident. All residents and their families are assigned a therapist who also provide case management services and in this facet concentrate on maximizing beneficial contact and communication between SJCH, the child, the court system, and his or her family. Our therapists are experienced in managing complicated reunification processes, therapeutic visitation, and transitioning children to foster and adoptive families.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

SJCH has therapists specially trained in trauma focused therapy, play therapy, and reactive attachment disorders. SJCH houses an onsite JCPS school which can serve children in grades K - 8. In addition, an Education Coordinator works with each child's treatment team and liaisons with the school system in order to make sure that each child's educational needs and rights are addressed in a timely and appropriate fashion.
