Crossroads Treatment Center is designed specifically for adolescent males whose primary service need is treatment for sexually acting out and/or sexual offending behaviors (non-adjudicated). CTC helps adolescent males take accountability for their behaviors, gain understanding of their choices, and develop a plan to remain safe in the community. CTC provides an on-campus school under the direction of the Hardin County School District. For youth that are not able to reunite with their family, Sunrise's continuum of care provides opportunity for youth to step down to less restrictive placement options that support relapse prevention and behavior management skills gained at CTC.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Family connections are supported through individual and family therapy sessions, when possible, to ensure that visits (both supervised and unsupervised) are successful. Family members are invited to attend monthly treatment team meetings and are encouraged to be involved in all aspects of the client's treatment. When needed, program staff provide transportation for home visits.

Special Interventions Available Internally

Counseling staff are available 24/7 to assist youth in taking accountability for their behaviors, gaining understanding of their choices, and develop a plan to remain safe in the community. These goals are accomplished through a combination of relapse prevention treatment and training in the skills necessary to be responsible young men. Clients receive individual, group and family therapy. The Pathways treatment program is used in individual and group therapy to address sexual abuse and sexual offenses; this therapy is led by a JSOCCP certified therapist.
