Our program trains the entire treatment team in the Positive Discipline evidence based practice model we use and specializes in the individualized treatment approach that every client deserves. Our success is seen in the credentials and experience of our staff, the longevity of our foster parents, and the number of clients who have found forever homes through our foster-to-adopt emphasis across the Commonwealth.

## Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Our program therapist actively works with biological families in family therapy, when directed to do so by Dcbs and the permanency goal is return to parent. It is our goal to support the family's success and healing once a child returns home. The support of a Family Connection is something we strive for in every client's life and permanency is addressed from the minute a client is referred and admitted to our program. The biological family's input is vital to what we do in treatment. When families need our assistance, we work with them through flexible scheduling, counseling, supervised visitation, transportation, and other creative means of support. It is a privilege to be a guest in a family's life, and our staff expectation is to honor that privilege through respect of the family.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

Our program therapist is certified and is also working on the TFCBT certification through Sunrise clinical training services. He has several years experience working with children and adults in the behavioral health field and the prison system. Our team also partners with The Ridge and Dr. Reisor for psychiatric services and medication management as needed as well as other psychiatrists in our communities.
