## Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Our program therapist actively works with biological families in family therapy, when the permanency goal is return to parent, and the state requests these services. This is put into place in order to better support the family's success and healing once a child returns home to their biological family. The support of a family connection is something we strive for in every client's life, and permanency is addressed from the minute a client is admitted to our program. The biological family's input is vital to what we do in treatment. When families need our assistance, we work with them through flexible scheduling, family counseling, transportation assistance, supervised visitation, and other creative means of support. It is a privilege to be a guest in a family's life, and our staff expectation is to honor that privilege through respect of the family.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

Our current therapist is certified in TFEBT and he has several years experience working with adults and youth in several different settings to include the prison system and was a clinic director for alcohol and drug abuse for 10+ years of his career. Our team also partners with The Ridge for psychiatric services and medication management as well as other psychiatrists in the communities where our foster families live.
